

## Who is ORBA?

Currently, thirty-nine churches make up the body of followers of Christ known as the Ogeechee River Baptist Asociation (ORBA). These missionary Baptist churches are located in Bulloch, Candler, and northern Bryan counties. They have voluntarily banded together to reach a unity and effectiveness in ministry that would have most likely eluded them if sought as individual congregations. The Purpose of ORBA is clear and directive. "We exist to help our churches in fulfilling the Great Commission." This Great Commission is Christ's charge and command: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." Matthew28:19-20

#### What is the WW Mann Center?

The WW Mann Conference and Retreat Center is a 75 acre campground owned by ORBA and located near Brooklet, GA, in rural Bulloch County. The Center is designed to provide a serenely rural, semi-isolated, worshipful atmosphere for groups who want to think and pray, recharge their emotional and mental engines, and/or have opportunities to "grow deeper" in their walk with Christ. It is a prime location where folks can get away from the "hustle and bustle" of everyday life and relax, meditate, pray, and "recoup" from the stress and strain of our "fast-paced" society. The Center has overnight cabins that sleep up to 25 people each, a small dining hall/meeting room, a larger dining hall/meeting room, a chapel that seats approximately 100, a lodge with private rooms, a gazebo, and an amphitheater.



Who can use the Mann Center?

The Mann Center rents out facilities to church groups, school groups, private citizens, and others, as long as they adhere to our policy of making sure their actions glorify God. Small group retreats, teaching conferences, and weekend gatherings find the Mann Center a great venue for their purposes. Annually, ORBA sponsors two weeks of children's summer camp known as "Camp I AM." Lifechanging decisions for Christ form a staple in the fabric of "retreat and camp life."

How is the Mann Center maintained and operationally funded?

The vast majority of the Mann Center's annual budget comes from fees paid by groups and individuals who use the facility. This income each year is barely enough to fund required facilities and grounds upkeep and maintenance, minor repairs, and workers' salaries. This income resource certainly cannot fund major repairs and improvements, or the purchase of needed, new equipment. In the early years of the Mann Center's existence, churches built buildings, worked with landscaping, and offered help with minor maintenance and repairs. The passing of time has taken its toll. Now is the time for a major facelift and updating.

Why is the Mann Center unique in Georgia and important to ORBA?

Though camp grounds like the Mann Center were once found liberally scattered across the state, only about a dozen are still functioning today. In its 43rd year, the Mann Center has been transformed from the farmland it was when it was gifted to the Association. Over the decades, the churches of ORBA have prayed together, planned and developed a unique camping vision, given financially, and worked cooperatively to develop this wonderful facility. Now it is time for us to re-think, envision anew, and stand up once again with our support for this worthy cause.



## BUILD THE "WW MANN CENTER" TRUST FUND...

The funds in the Trust will actually be property of the Ogeechee River Baptist Association. They will be held by the Georgia Baptist Foundation (GBF). The GBF holds and invests millions of dollars in trust funds for various groups. Because they invest such large sums, they have access to prime interest return rates.

Only the annually accrued interest from the Trust can be used for upkeep and development of the Center. The principal of the Mann Trust Fund is never to be invaded or reduced. Therefore, these monies will continue to produce needed revenue for many years, and even decades to come.

Investment in the Trust fund should be activated by the donor in consultation with an authorized representative of the Georgia Baptist Foundation.
